- How's the full-day schedule going?
  - Team teaching (2 teachers) with about
     30+ students in the classroom.
  - Students have more instructional time.
  - Busses are arriving on time.
  - There is some additional car traffic, but it goes by smoothly after dismissal.

- HMS Campus Update
  - FEMA awarded PSS with \$25 million to renovate our HMS Campus.
  - 3 Projects
    - Purchase and set up 20 temporary classrooms.
    - Repair/Replace damaged fence.
    - Replace damaged buildings.

 The last information from former COE was that the governor approved to proceed with getting the temporary classrooms. According to PAO Patrick Guerrero, it is currently on hold due to a protest regarding the bidding process. The AG's Office is reviewing the case.


